- 2. Are the logistical and process challenges being addressed (e.g., how colleges receive SBA results?)**





Use of Placement Agreement

- **No formal data yet but no major complaints from colleges**
- **Challenges:**
 - Decentralized system
 - Students responsible for providing their scores
 - Data on placement methods collected locally, if at all
- **Agreement extended through Class of 2020**





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Bridge to College: Framing Questions, Part I

- 1. How many students have taken the courses and what are the plans for increasing capacity?**
- 2. Any information yet on how students who took the courses have transitioned to postsecondary education?**
- 3. Any progress on the courses being accepted by the NCAA?**

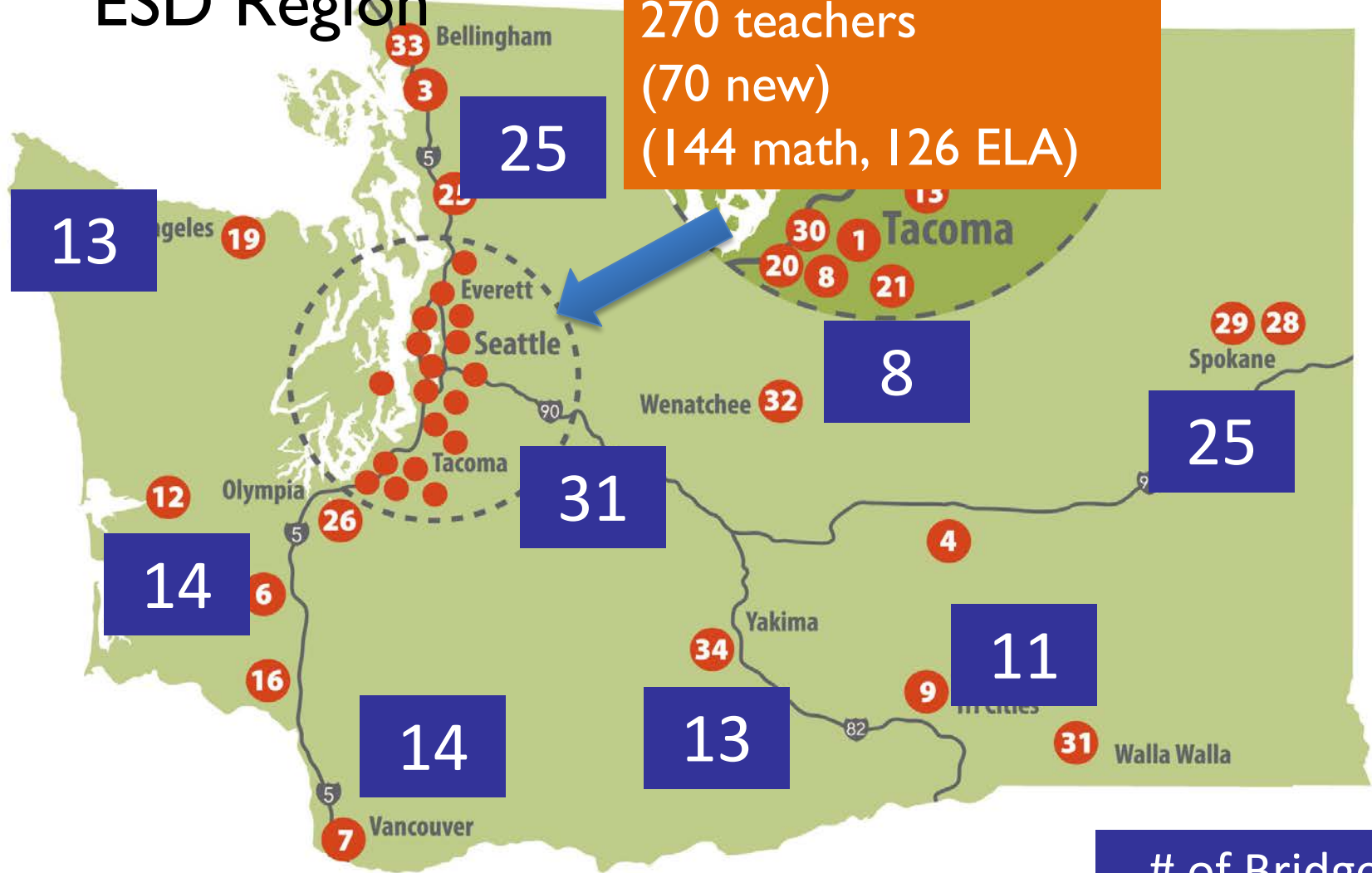

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2017-18:

Preparing for a Post-Grant Future

- Refining course infrastructure to provide more flexible options for supporting a broader range of teachers
- Expanding the focus to junior year offerings in both English and math
- Strengthening and formalizing the higher education connection
- Working with OSPI to implement ESHB 2224



What's the impact of ESHB 2224 on the Bridge to College courses?

- Shifting high school assessment to 10th grade affects placement agreement
- *Bridge to College* courses as approved local courses and “objective alternative” assessments
 - Refine assessments and rubrics
 - Connect with HS & Beyond plans
