Role of the Board

 RCW 28A.657.100 directs the Superintendent of Public Instruction to provide a report twice per year to the SBE on progress made by school districts designated as required action districts (RAD).

RAD Cohort 1, Designated in 2011

- Lakeridge Elementary School, Renton School District
- Morton Junior-Senior High School, Morton School District
- Onalaska Middle School, Onalaska School District
- Soap Lake Middle and High School, Soap Lake School District

RAD Cohort 2, Designated in 2014

- Steward Middle School, Tacoma School District
- Wellpinit Elementary School, Wellpinit School District
- Tulalip Elementary School, Marysville School District
- Washington Middle School, Yakima School District



Role of the Board

- In 2014-2015, RAD Cohort 1 will be considered for release from RAD.
- Board action will take place at the March 2015 Board meeting.
- The districts may be:
 - Recommended for release from RAD by OSPI; SBE shall release them (<u>RCW 28A.657.100</u>).
 - Designated to remain in RAD I status.
 - Assigned to RAD II.

After a district is in required action for 3 years, what happens?

- District no longer has a school on the PLA list (Priority-lowest 5% tier)
- The schools that were on the PLA list have a positive trend in reading and math in all students, based on the most recent three-year average
- Made progress in closing the opportunity gap NO

OSPI Recommends


