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

Student Discipline


- Multiple areas of consideration for indicators
 - Negative impact on student achievement
 - Total # of exclusions
 - # of days missed
 - Disproportionality
 - Positive climates
 - Alternative interventions
 - Due process
 - Petitions for readmission submitted and granted
 - Students requesting hearings

Recommended Indicator: Proportionality of exclusions to enrollment and number of days lost



Discipline Disproportionality (2012-2013)





Access to Pre-K

- Impacts student's readiness to enter school
 - Could improve performance on WaKIDS indicator

Recommended Indicator: Percentage of 3 & 4 year olds enrolled in Pre-K in Washington and compared nationally

Family-Related

- Parental educational attainment
 - Impacts readiness to learn
 - Potential predictor of student's academic attainment

Potential Indicator: Percentage of children in families where head of household does not have high school diploma

- Parent engagement
 - Expectations and engagement can impact student motivation, persistence, and achievement

Potential Indicator: Based on survey



Teacher-Related

- Teachers are largest in-school factor that impacts student achievement
 - Quality and distribution of teachers
 - Human capital pipeline

Potential Indicator: Distribution of quality teachers (based on TPEP)

Potential Indicator: Percent of students with teacher outside of endorsement (PESB developing data)

Potential Indicator: Candidate pool alignment with system need (PESB developing market analysis)



Language Acquisition

- In previous 5491 report, recommended incorporate in 4th (3rd) grade and 8th grade proficiency indicators
 - % of students in K-3 that transition, % of students in K-8 that transition.

Recommended Revision: Graduation rate of Former ELL students

Adequate Growth

- In previous 5491 report, student growth percentile incorporated into the 8th grade High School Readiness indicator
 - Not well suited for large population analysis

Recommended Revision: Percentage of students meeting Adequate Growth Percentile in 4th and 6th grade

Staff Recommended Revisions

• New Indicators:

- Discipline: Disproportionality, number of days lost
- Access to Early Childhood Education: Percentage of 3-4 year olds enrolled in Pre-K (part of WaKIDS)

Revised Indicators:

- ★ Language Acquisition: Remove from 3rd and 8th grade, include Former ELL graduation rate as sub-indicator in High School Graduation Rate
- Adequate Growth: Remove Student Growth Gap from 8th grade, add percentage of students meeting Adequate Growth Percentile in 4th and 6th grade to 8th grade/high school readiness indicator
