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RAD Cohort I: Overview

Authorized by State Legislature in 2010 session

(E2SSB 6696)

- •Goal: Dramatic turnaround of persistently lowest achieving schools.
- •Selection Criteria:
 - -Among lowest 5% in Reading and Math in 2008, 2009, and 2010.
 - -Declining trends over 3-year period.



RAD Cohort I: Updated Timeline

By March 2015: OSPI will identify persistently lowest achieving schools (E2SSB 5329):

- Based on 2012, 2013, and 2014 data.
- Considers both state assessment data and Adjusted 5-year Cohort Graduation Rates.

March 2015: OSPI will notify superintendents of progress toward meeting exit criteria.

March 2015: OSPI will share findings and recommendation with Board.



Priority and Focus School Lists: Schools NOT Designated on Either List for 2015-16

➤ Based on "All students" group performance, none of the four schools will be designated as a Priority school for 2015-16.

Note: Soap Lake SD is the only RAD with a school on the Priority list for 2015-16 (Soap Lake Elementary School).


➤ Based on subgroup performance, none of the four schools will be designated as a Focus school for 2015-16.



No Longer in Lowest 5%

Achievement Index: Schools no longer in lowest 5% of all schools.

- Three schools rank in the top 50% of all schools (1 placed in *Very Good* Tier and 2 placed in *Good* Tier).
- The 4th school is placed in the *Fair* Tier.





Significant Upward Trend: Schools Show Substantial Improvement and Cut Achievement Gap











OSPI Recommendations

Based on these data, OSPI will likely recommend:

- •Morton, Onalaska, and Renton school districts exit Required Action District status.
- •Soap Lake School District continues in Required Action District status, since it has one school designated as a Priority school for 2015-16 (Soap Lake Elementary School).
- •Modify RAD language to eliminate "Soap Lake" dilemma.
