Federal Discipline Guidance

- Package of guidance and resources
 - Provides context for what will be looked for in reviews and investigations
 - Provides suggestions for improvements in policy and practice
 - Focuses on protecting civil rights of students
- Department of Education (USED) Office of Civil Rights is currently reviewing Seattle Public Schools
 - Disproportionate discipline of students according to race/ethnicity

Considerations

- Guidance emphasizes that districts and schools have an obligation to ensure fairness and equity
 - Title IV prohibition of discrimination on basis of race in public schools
 - Title VI prohibition of discrimination on basis of race by recipients of federal funds
 - USED Office of Civil Rights and Department of Justice responsible for enforcement

Federal Concerns

- Research findings of impacts of exclusionary discipline:
 - Increased dropouts
 - Decreased student achievement
 - Disengagement
 - Increased behavioral problems
 - Increased involvement with the juvenile justice system
- Different treatment of students
- Differential impact on students

Guiding Principles

3 guiding principles:

- Create positive school environments and focus on prevention
- Establish clear, appropriate consistent expectations and consequences
- Consistently use data to evaluate discipline practices' fairness and equity and consistently improve

Actions and Strategies

Positive school climate

- Restorative justice
- PBIS and other tiered intervention approaches
- New social-emotional curricula
- Staff training
- Clearly defined roles for law enforcement in schools
- Involve families in policy development

Actions and Strategies

- Expectations and consequences
 - Set high expectations
 - Involve school community in policy development (students, teachers, parents)
 - Set developmentally appropriate consequences
 - Remove students as last resort

Actions and Strategies

- Fairness and equity
 - Train staff in implementing discipline policies equitably
 - Use data for continuous improvement

Board Resolution

- Affirms commitment to working to improve discipline practices in Washington
- Asserts intention to explore incorporation of a discipline indicator in the indicators of educational system health
- Resolves to encourage districts to examine their discipline policies and practices in light of the federal guidance

- What aspects of the discipline issue are most important for the Board to measure?
- What are the Board's next steps in addressing this issue?
