Our programs and materials will focus on academics, building relationships, and the positive protective factors that enable students to meet or exceed state standards, graduate from high school, and be better prepared for the workforce or college. The quality of one’s education directly impacts the individual’s economic independence; as well as workforce development and economic competitiveness at both the state and national level.

Our Goals:

1. Educate students, parents, and communities about the impact academic success will have on one’s future.
2. Promote the positive protective factors which increase the chances of success in high school.
3. Help students graduate from high school.
4. Research and analyze existing “outside the school day” support systems and learning environments.
5. Promote programs which connect students to role models in order to teach the value of education and how to thrive in a challenging learning environment.
6. Create and facilitate additional learning opportunities in schools and communities, outside the school day.
7. Help with home-to-school communication to facilitate student accountability.
8. Inspire students to excel and seek higher levels of academic success.
9. To make the educational “gap” so small, so that no student will fall through.
10. Reduce youth violence and substance abuse by helping students develop a more positive attitude towards school, improve attendance, and achieve greater academic success.
