# **North Central High School**

The following is an excerpt from the school website:

#### **School Profile**

North Central High School is one of five comprehensive high schools in the Spokane School District. Located just north of the downtown area of Spokane, North Central added a new facility, including a weight room and locker rooms in 2010. In 2014, a new STEM wing was completed which includes a 24-classroom complex that features new math and science classrooms, along with the new home for the Institute of Science and Technology. The counseling staff divides the student population alphabetically to provide all students and their families a more personal touch. North Central High School is accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and is a member of the Pacific Northwest Association for College Admission Counseling and complies with the NACAC Statement of Principles of Good Practice.

#### **CURRICULUM**

North Central currently has 17 sections of honor level courses. Honors courses are offered to all students in the areas of English, Social Studies, and Mathematics beginning in the freshman year. North Central High School offers 20 Advanced Placement courses and 45 sections in the following subjects: A.P. Cambridge, A.P. Cap-stone, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, United States History, European History, World History, Comparative Politics, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Biology, Psychology, Chemistry, Physics, Computer Programming, Environmental Science, Music Theory, and Studio Art - 2D.

North Central High School currently has the largest Advanced Placement program in Eastern Washington for a school of its size. North Central was recognized as the College Board Western Regional Innovation Award Winner for 2009-2010 for our college preparatory programs and academic press. North Central has also been recognized by U.S. News and World Report, Newsweek and the Washington Post for its exemplary AP Program.

In addition, students may apply for college credit for Biological Solutions and Spanish through Eastern Washington University. For Photography, Business Computers and Teaching Academy credit can be received through the Community Colleges of Spokane. Students may also access the Skills Center and work experience through our Applied Technology, Business, and Family and Consumer Science courses.

We currently offer AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) classes at all levels.

### **Montessori K-8**

The following is an excerpt from the school website:

#### **School Overview**

The mission of Spokane Public Montessori is to provide a quality public Montessori education in a culturally, racially, and economically diverse school community.

Montessori in Spokane Public Schools celebrated its 25th anniversary in 2012. It was created by a committed group of parents, whom began the board known as SCAMC, Spokane Community Advocates for a Montessori Curriculum. In 2008 the organization changed its name to CoMP, Community of Montessori Parents. The CoMP Board of Directors is the parent governing board which oversees the Montessori program. It is CoMP's responsibility to maintain quality training, accreditation, and support to classrooms in order to maintain good standing within Spokane Public Schools.

As a public school, there is no tuition charge to parents.



All teachers, Montessori included, draw from a common source: the child and our "best practices" for teaching and learning. There are, however, unique aspects to a Montessori environment.

- 3 year age span
   (3-6 years, 6-9 years, and 9-12 years)
- Individually prepared lessons small group lessons (2-6 children)
- Uninterrupted work periods (2-3 hours) child schedules work
- "Hands on" materials for self-teaching
