- Helps students create their Post-Secondary Plan quickly and easily
- Uses a Data Warehouse built from SIS data from around the state

Features

- Based on the state template
- Student information comes from the District SIS

Benefits

- Transfer's, GLO's and Waivers can be added

- Captures activities and experiences for college applications, resumes, cover letters, etc.
- Number of credit requirements can be increased to match district requirements
- Credit and class information is entered only once

- Guardians can Log-in to view their student's plan and approve
- Accessible anytime from home, library, school labs
- Software is provided to all districts in the state at no additional cost




Usage



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



WHAT IS REQUIRED TO GRADUATE FROM HIGH SCHOOL?

To graduate from high school in Washington, students must meet three requirements:

- Earn high school credit (at least the minimum number required by your district);
- . Meet standard on State tests and end-of-course exams; and
- Prepare a High School & Beyond Plan.

WHAT IS THE HIGH SCHOOL & BEYOND PLAN?

The High School & Beyond Plan is a collection of written documents that helps students set goals for the future and then take the steps needed to achieve those goals.

- The student's interests and abilities, and the relationship to higher current career goals;
- A four-year plan for courses taken during high school that is aligned to fulfill high school graduation requirements;
- Identification of exams student needs to graduate from high school and for post-secondary goals (State assessments, ACT, SAT, etc.);
- Research on postsecondary programs related to the student's goals;
- · A completed resume or activity log;
- A budget for life after high school; and
- Demonstration of preparedness through presentation of HSBP.

Students who are focusing on Coreer & Technical Education courses in high school will prepare a Program of Study to design a personal plan for their high school and postsecondary experience. This plan, along with the student's classroom instruction, will provide practical experience and enhance the student's personal communication, leadership, and teamwork skills.





Student Selection Option for Counselor


