

We also offer robust set of resources for educators, including skills based syllabus that allows for local content - the syllabus structure is meant to provide support rather than a rigid pacing plan.





The Cambridge Pathway, grades K-12:

Flexibility

Our programs are compatible with other curricula, so you are free to build your unique curricula. Schools have the flexibility to offer all the stages or individual stages and individual subjects within each stage. The curriculum is flexible enough to be tailored to local culture and ethos.







Emphasis on a Learner Centered Approach

Cambridge International uses backward design for curricula and assessments with five Cambridge learner attributes in mind, supporting and emphasizing the need for teachers to develop key skills for all students:

- Confident in working with information and ideas their own and that of others
- Responsible for themselves, responsive to and respectful of others
- Reflective as learners, developing their ability to learn
- Innovative and equipped for new and future challenges
- Engaged intellectually and socially, and ready to make a difference

Currently, colleges and universities all over the world accept Cambridge qualifications. Colleges and universities that have credit and placement policies for Cambridge qualifications include, but is not limited to, Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), all of the IVY's, Duke University, Washington State University, Columbia University, New York University, University of Washington, University of Virginia, Florida State University, North Carolina State University, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and several others. Such universities and colleges in U.S. recognize the Cambridge Advanced coursework as rigorous college level coursework approved for high school GPA weighting.

Recently, in 2019, the Washington Senate passed legislation which asks the 36 public institutions of higher education in the state of Washington to grant undergraduate credit for students who receive a grade of E or higher on a Cambridge International A or AS level exam.

Cambridge International also collaborates with Higher Education Advisory Councils on program and assessment development. These councils include representatives from several higher education institutions, such as University of California Los Angeles (UCLA), Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Duke University, University of Washington, Florida State University, and Vanderbilt University.

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
